



European Glass Context 2020 exhibitions

General information

Background

European Glass Context 2020 forms part of a biennial symposium for European contemporary glass and ceramics on the island of Bornholm in Denmark. Through comprehensive exhibitions, workshops, master classes and lectures, we wish to discuss and present the tendencies and best of contemporary European glass of today. This event is motivated by a desire to promote the disciplines and trades of glass and ceramic art at European and global levels. Through this event we aim to cover the topic and show an overview of contemporary European glass and ceramics with changing biannual exposure. European Glass Context is jointly organized by The Royal Danish Academy School of Design Bornholm, Bornholm Art Museum and Grønbechs Gård.

Artists from all 27 members of the European Union as well as the UK, Iceland, Norway and Switzerland are invited to participate. Artists must be of the nationality or be a resident in the country they represent.

EGC2020 Exhibitions – general information

Two large curated exhibitions at the Bornholm Art Museum and Grønbechs Gård will showcase the current tendencies and the best of European glass. The exhibitions are curated with personal invitations, as well as an open call, where individual artists, artists associations, individual curators, artists, designers and crafts makers working with glass can apply for participation.

Artwork can be made in any technique and form of artistic expression. The materials used in the artwork must be predominantly glass. Objects must be unique and not part of serial or industrial production. Artwork must be available throughout the full exhibition period. Artwork must be contemporary and made in 2016 or later, work produced before this time will not be accepted.

The exhibitions are documented with an exhibition catalog. This publication also serves as a European statement and reference book for contemporary glass in Europe.

Ca. 60 artists will be represented with major significant works. A curatorial group of 4-6 glass professionals from selected regions in Europe will make the final selection of artists representing all 31 invited European countries.

Exhibition categories:

Four underlying categories will shape the exhibitions. By setting a contemporary framework for the exhibitions, we want to put together two exhibitions that will largely reflect significant and new works, as well as the innovative, activist, experimental and sustainable trends in European glass.

Site-specific installation projects or works: could be with reference to Bornholm, or a site specific place in Europe.

UN Sustainability Goals: works based on one or more of the UN's sustainability goals.

Craft: unique master pieces and contemporary objects.

Social or political practices: works or processes originating from social or political practices.

Who can participate in the EGC2020 exhibitions?

All 27 members of the European Union as well as Iceland, Norway and Switzerland and UK are invited to participate in the EGC2020 exhibitions. Artists must be of the nationality or be a resident in the country they represent. Please use the application form and submit your application to:

The EGC2020 + Prizes and Jury

Two prizes of € 10.000 € and € 5000 will be given to two outstanding artists or artists groups, selected among the participants in the exhibitions. A jury of three international members with expertise within the field of glass will go through the exhibitions before the opening and select the prize winners. The winners will be announced at the exhibition opening.

Exhibition catalogue

An exhibition catalogue will be produced presenting all artists with images of their work, critical notes and a short CV, as well as essays on contemporary glass.

Special requirements

Artwork will be exhibited on regular neutral plinths with regular museum lighting. Should the artist have special exposure requirements other than provided by the exhibition venues, this must be provided by the artist.

Artwork, which requires audio and visual equipment, this must be provided by the artist.

Complicated, as well as extraordinary time consuming installations of artwork, must be carried out by the artist themselves.

Insurance

It is the responsibility of the artist to take out and pay for insurance during all transportation and shipping to and from the destination of origin, to the final destination at the exhibition venue on Bornholm. EGC2020 will insure the artwork upon its arrival at the exhibition venues at Grønbechs Gård and Bornholm Art Museum and once the artwork has been inspected for transport damages.

Shipping

It is the responsibility of the artist to organize and pay for shipping to and from his or her own country to and from the exhibition venue on Bornholm.

Customs

Artwork shipped from outside of EU, must be registered on an ATA Carnet or otherwise make sure that EGC2020 will receive no extra tax expenses. ECC2020 will not accept work without correct import permission, or accept any expenses related to import of artworks.

Shipping Stipends

A shipping stipend will help cover part of the cost. The stipends will be transferred to the artist individually, after the event and when the EGC2020 Secretariat has received copies of original shipping documents from the artist. Specialized stipend forms should be used for this. Should the cost of shipping be less than the shipping stipend, the artist will only receive the actual cost of shipping. We have divided the European countries into 3 geographical zones in relation to Denmark. The size of the stipends depends on which country and geographical zone the artist comes from.

- May 4th – 7th Selection process with curator group on Bornholm, Denmark.
- May 20th Selected artists will be notified and list of names will be published on www.europeanglasscontext.com
- June 1th Deadline for submitting catalogue material
- Aug. 24th – 28th Artworks must be delivered at the exhibition venue
- Sep. 12th Exhibition openings
- Nov 15th Exhibitions ends
- Nov 16th – 20th Artworks will be packed in the original boxes and packing materials
- Nov 23rd – 27th Artworks must be collected by the artists at the exhibition venue

Visiting Bornholm

With European Glass Context 2020 we hope to attract as many visitors to Bornholm as possible. An important part of the biennials is to create a European platform for glass artists, curators, critics, collectors etc. to meet and network. Many local artists, smaller museums and alternative exhibition spaces are planning exhibitions and happenings during EGC2020. All adjoining events will be listed on our website as we get notified of projects. On the website you will also find suggestions for traveling to Bornholm and accommodation at various price levels.

Exhibition opening and award ceremony September 12th 2020.

The opening and award ceremony will take place at Bornholm Art Museum at 14.00 and at Grønbechs Gaard at 16.00. The jury will have selected the 2 prizewinners of the ECC2018 award; the winners will be announced at the opening. In the evening we will be hosting a party at The Royal Danish Academy School of Design Bornholm.
